Dear Dr. Zawila-Niedzwiecki:

Perhaps you received a letter in January from Rich Guldin, IUFRO's Lead Donor, inviting you to participate in a challenge program — *the Eberswalde Circle* — to build IUFRO's Strategic Fund. Through the end of April, 9 donors have contributed €16,125 in response to the January letter. I'm thankful for this initial surge of support! But we need greater participation to achieve our goal, so now I am asking for your help.

The goal of the Eberswalde Circle is to secure 125 donations of €1,892. The goal commemorates IUFRO's creation 125 years ago in 1892 at a meeting of research institute directors in Eberswalde, Germany. The book prepared for IUFRO's 100th birthday chronicles discussions among German institute directors, whose vision was to create a broader network that included forest research institutes in other countries. This year, IUFRO again celebrates their success.

The IUFRO Strategic Fund is exclusively to support activities of strategic importance globally, such as identifying emerging issues and science gaps, increasing interdisciplinary scientific cooperation with other parties, and seizing unexpected opportunities to bring science rapidly to new policy formulation.
