Dear colleagues,

In late April this year, the Board and Council of the European Forest Institute met in Dublin. Discussions focused around the important developments of the Institute, since the previous ordinary Council meeting in Vienna in 2014, and especially on the implementation of the new EFI Strategy. It is encouraging for all of us dedicated to, and involved in the work of EFI, that the Council confirms their engagement in our activity and emphasizes the relevance and importance of the work of the organization. In Dublin the Council did exactly that. EFI has made a difference and it is recognized. The Council also elected new members to the board.

EFI's new strategy is ambitious in its vision, as it aims at positioning the Institute as a globally recognized European science-policy platform. European forests need a reliable voice in Europe and in Brussels in particular. ThinkForest has represented this voice for five years and we will strive to make it continue to do so. To underline this I would like to quote the current Minister for Foreign Affairs of Sweden, Margot Wallström, when she recently expressed: We need more facts in politics, less so politics in facts.

Research by EFI member organizations and the EFI Secretariat is the core of our activity. In these days when people all over the world engage in science marches and speak out towards the tendency to undermine scientific-based information, we should stay firm in defending the research-based knowledge needed to make better policies. I trust that all member organizations are with us in this endeavour. I am also confident that the EFI Scientific Advisory Board will assist us and guide us in our further work. We are very grateful for their contributions.

I look forward to welcoming you all to the EFI Annual Conference 2017 in Oslo in October.
